CARE OF SEEDLINGS

- ◆ Seedlings should be packed and shipped in wet moss or other medium, kept cool (less than 35° F) and kept moist through the planting process. Exposure to sun and wind can kill a seedling in less than 30 seconds.
- ◆ Plant seedlings as soon as possible after they are received, keeping roots moist throughout the planting process.
- ◆ If storage is necessary, store seedlings in a cool, moist, shaded location, no longer than 7 days. If longer - refrigerate. Do not stack bundles for a prolonged period of time.
- ◆ If planting is delayed longer than 7 days after receipt of the seedlings, heel the seedlings in a shaded area and keep them moist, or refrigerate.
- ◆ To heel in seedlings, dig a trench in the soil, place the seedlings in the trench and cover the roots with soil.
- ◆ Avoid dipping roots into water as moisture retaining particles will be washed off. Mist seedlings to keep them moist, or use Terra-Sorb™.
- ◆ Water absorbent/retention dip, Terra-Sorb™, may help conserve moisture on seedling roots in dry weather and during the planting process. See Page 15 for Terra-Sorb™.

FENCING ENCLOSURES

Used to protect apple trees from browsing and antler rubbings. Tree wraps should also be used to protect from girdling by rodents. Install tree wraps in September and remove in May. Enclosures should be a minimum of 5 feet high and approximately 4 feet square in shape. Fencing material should be sturdy enough so deer can not push it. Corner post can be metal or wood. See Page 15 for Tree Wraps/Bark Protectors.

CONIFER TREES

Red Pine

Valuable for timber, reforestation, windbreak, and wildlife habitat. Moderate to fast growing on a good site. Grows on coarse, well-drained sandy or sandy loam type soil. Full sun, tolerates partial shade, can tolerate dry, windy, or rocky conditions.

White Pine

Michigan State Tree! Used for timber, Christmas trees, and wildlife habitat. This soft needled pine tolerates 25% to 75% shade, making it a desirable species for under planting. It does well on dry to somewhat poorly drained sandy or loamy soils.

White Spruce

Large tree native to Northern Michigan. Short, blue-green needles. Their density provides good wildlife cover. Prefers moist, well-drained porous soil. Tolerates moist clays & partial shade. Used for lumber, windbreaks, wildlife, ornamental, and Christmas trees.

Blue Spruce

Does well on a wide range of soil types from well-drained sandy soils to heavier clay soils, in sun to partial shade. Beautiful ornamental and Christmas trees. Excellent for windbreaks, soil stabilization, and wildlife cover.

Norway Spruce

Needles are 1" long, limbs hang downward giving the tree a graceful look. Fastest growing of all spruces. Easily transplanted, does best in loamy soils of average moisture, tolerates full sun to full shade conditions. Beautiful hedges, wildlife cover and highly recommended for windbreaks.

Balsam Fir

A popular Christmas tree because of long-persistent needles that are not shed readily. Aromatic needles dark green above, pale beneath. Native Michigan tree, grows in a variety of sites, including poorly drained swamps to well drained uplands. Less tolerant of poorly drained conditions, and more tolerant of warmer and drier climates than spruce.

Northern White Cedar

Small to medium-sized tree. Grows on poorly drained sites to upland dry, calcareous (medium to high pH) soils. Shade tolerant, very slow growing. Uses include posts and poles, logs, furniture, windbreaks, and lumber.

Hemlock

This is the only Hemlock native to eastern Canada and is a prominent tree in the forests of Maritime provinces. Medium sized tree growing up to 30 meters. Hemlock can be easily shaped for hedge or screen use. Prefers well drained soils.

Tamarack

Tamarack can tolerate a wide range of soil conditions but grows most commonly on wet to moist organic soils. The heavy, durable wood is used principally for pulpwood, but also for posts, poles, rough lumber and fuelwood. Wildlife use the tree for food and nesting; it is also esthetically appealing and has significant potential as an ornamental.

HARDWOOD TREES

Northern Red Oak

A symmetrical, medium sized tree. Develops a short massive trunk in the open, with a broad crown. Does best on deep, rich loamy soils, but does well on sandy soils and wet sites. Needs full sun. Wildlife acorn food source.

Hybrid Poplar

Fast growing, Sprouts well when cut. Does well on most sites except very dry soils. Needs full sunlight. Valuable for windbreaks, pulpwood, and fuel.

White Birch

Shade intolerant, fast growing. Planted as an ornamental. This species is suitable to large area plantings. Typically grown in clumps of two or three trees for ornamental purposes.

Red Maple

Native hardwood: shade-tolerant; relatively fast growing; moderately long lived; sprouts vigorously. Uses include lumber and preferred deer food.

WILDLIFE SHRUBS/TREES

Red Osier Dogwood

Common throughout the state in open, wet places; lake shores; stream banks; swamps; marshes; and sand dunes. Valuable as a landscape plant because of its showy red stems. One of the most highly preferred deer food.

Deciduous, border, hedge, screen shrub, 8' to 12' high. Red fruits, colorful fall foliage. Full sun to part shade, moist, acid soil. Fruit highly prized by wildlife.

Tubers that produce a bush that is a magnet for butterflies. Blue-purple flowers that bloom from mid summer until the first frost. Bush grows 3' to 5' tall. Easy to grow. Sun loving.

Mountain Ash

Small fast growing tree. Lots of showy white flowers and orange fruit that are persistent in winter. Excellent food for birds (grouse and turkey). Moderately shade-tolerant.

Colorful, large, approximately 25' high, multiple stemmed shrub or small tree. White flowers in the spring, red fruit in the fall. Prefers full sun, likes wide variety of soils. Excellent for birds, especially grouse.

Service Berry

Also called Juneberry. Deciduous shrub approximately 12' high. White early spring flowers, small edible black fruit, golden fall foliage. Tendency to sucker. Sun or part shade, likes moist, but well-aerated, acidic soil. Excellent for wildlife.

Small to medium sized tree. Native to cold climates. Small, edible fruit. Good for wildlife and making jelly and preserves.

CRABAPPLE TREES

Red Splendor

Foliage is glossy reddish-green turning reddish purple in fall. Fruit makes excellent food for wildlife. Small bright red fruit is persistent through winter. Extremely cold hardy for northern regions. Drought tolerant. Prefers full sun.

Thunderchild

Foliage is deep purple with pink flowers. Fruit makes excellent food for wildlife. Extremely cold hardy for northern regions. Drought tolerant. Resistant to fireblight. Prefers full sun.

TWO species of pear/plum/cherry trees are needed for good pollination.



CHERRY TREES

5' Trees - Each Tree - \$25.00

Mesabi Cherry

Tree is another sweet-tart, long stemmed cherry with sugar content between pie cherries and Bing cherries. Fruit resembles Meteor but pit is smaller. Ripens early July.

Meteor Cherry

Tree produces a large, bright red cherry that is a vigorous producer. Slightly acidic flavor that is excellent for pies and sauce. Ripens early July.

Evan's Bali Cherry

Tree produces a sweet-tart cherry with fruit 1" in diameter. Fruit is much sweeter than other sour cherries. Extremely hardy and a great addition to any orchard. Ripens August.

PEAR TREES

6' Trees - Each Tree - \$25.00



Bartlett Pear

Produces a pear that is bright yellow. The fruit is aromatic and is outstanding for fresh eating. Along with its very sweet and juicy flavor for eating, it is widely used for canning and cooking because of its excellent taste. Ripens in mid-August.

Parker Pear

Type of a Manchurian pear. Large fruit, good eating, tender and juicy. Upright and vigorous grower. Ripens in mid August.

Summer Crisp Pear

Tree is hardy and fireblight resistant. Very sweet with excellent taste. Keeps well. Fruit is yellow with red blush. Ripens late September.



PLUM TREES

6' Trees - Each Tree - \$25.00

Pipestone Plum

A fine prune type plum with excellent quality suited for both home use or processing. Fruit is large size with a dark blue skin. Flesh is greenish-yellow, juicy and fine grained. Ripens late July.

Toka Plum

It is red and of medium size. This is one of the best pollinators for other plums. Richly flavored with apricot colored flesh. Ripens in mid August.

Mount Royal Plum

Very hardy and productive. Medium vigor. Excellent blue plum. Excellent for dessert, jam and preserves. Ripens in late August.



APPLE TREES

6' to 8' Trees

Trees are listed in order of ripening.

Yellow Transparent

Skin is clear yellow and the flesh is white. Very productive tree. Best used for cooking. Pick before maturity for better storage life. Ripens late July.

Norland

Well suited to very cold regions. Productive. Good cooking or eating apple. Very hardy. Keeps well in cold storage. Ripens mid August.

Connell Red

Similar to Fireside except that it has more intense red color. It is hardy, a heavy bearer, and excellent for eating or cooking with a distinctive flavor. Ripens late August.

State Fair

Bright red, juicy, good texture, all purpose apple. One of the best early apples for northern growers. Ripens late August to early September.

Wealthy

Excellent for fresh eating, pies, and sauces. Often bears red fruit after a couple of years. Keeps well. Very hardy. Ripens early September.

McIntosh

Popular bright red strain that colors to a solid blush without stripes. Proven by many years of production in commercial orchards. Ripens mid-September.

Cortland

A heavy annual cropper that bears large size fruit. Red striped apple that is white fleshed. Ripens mid-September.

Snow Sweet

Flavor is sweet with a tart balance and rich overtones, almost buttery. Extremely hardy and will grow well in cold climates. Good for cooking and baking. Ripens mid-September.

Honeycrisp

An exceptionally crisp and juicy apple. Stores well (*up to 5 months*). Ripens mid-September.

Wolf River

A local favorite, originated near Wolf River, Wisconsin. Large to very large apple, pale yellow/green with red blushes and stripes. Ripens late September to early October.

Honeygold

Golden color. Flesh is very crisp, yellow and juicy. Medium to large fruit. Similar to Golden Delicious, but storage qualities are much superior. Ripens late September to early October.

Red Prairie Spy

Excellent for baking and fresh eating. Long term-storage apple. Very productive. Ripens early October.

Sweet 16

Rosy red, smooth finish, fine-textured, crisp, high sugar, moderate acid apple with a unique pleasing flavor. The fruits are medium to large sized, It has good storage, handling, and culinary properties. Ripens late September to early October.

Wodarz

Uneven shaped apple firm and sweet. Used for eating and cooking. Good storage-ability (*up to 3 months*). Great apple for deer bait because of storage length. Extremely cold hardy for northern regions. Ripens in late September to early October.

Red Regent

Appealing red-striped apple with well-balanced flavor that is good for eating and cooking. Ripens early to mid-October.

All trees are ZONED for this area.

SUPPLIES & EQUIPMENT

Terra-Sorb™

Mix with water to form a gel-like compound, dip seedling roots, gel adheres to roots, holding moisture on roots. 8 oz. treats approximately 500 seedlings. Used during the planting process to increase seedling survival.

Algaecide

Controls algae in ponds all season. Granular that is easy to use. Prevents formation of heavy surface mats. Can be stored. Safe for humans, wildlife & fish. Treats 1/2 to one acre ponds.

A blue dye that controls submersed weeds & algae in ponds by filtering sunlight inhibiting photosynthesis. Gives water a crisp, clear, aqua-blue color. Safe for humans, wildlife, and fish. One quart treats one acre of water.

Private Landowner Assistance

The Conservation Districts of Delta and Schoolcraft County have partnered on two program initiatives to assist private landowners (Agriculture and Forestry/Wildlife).

Agriculture – The Michigan Agriculture Environmental Assurance Program (MAEAP) is a holistic approach to environmental protection. It helps farmers evaluate their entire operation and truly make sustainable management decisions balancing society's needs, the environment, and economics. MAEAP is a partnership effort that aims to protect natural resources and build positive communities by counseling Michigan farmers that operate farms of all sizes and all commodities on environmentally responsible agricultural production practices.

MAEAP has three programs that address different aspects of your farm: Farmstead, Cropping, and Livestock. MAEAP is based on scientifically supported standards that allow farms to address environmental concerns while remaining economically viable. Simply stated, agriculture by voluntary compliance instead of by regulation. By verifying your farm, you show your peers and neighbors that being a steward of the land is important to you.

All farm assessments are completely confidential and free.

Forestry/Wildlife – This forestland initiative is designed to increase active management of private forestland owned by individuals. The program provides information, education, and technical assistance to private forest landowners, local governments, and other citizens on forestland natural resource issues. The program encourages private landowners to work with local Conservation Districts in identifying their goals/objectives and then encourage active management through natural resource private sector referrals and follow-up assistance.

On-site assistance and information includes, but not limited to, forest management, wildlife management, forestland planning, wetland identification and regulatory procedures, soil erosion and sedimentation control, habitat management, forest health, tree and shrub planting, food plots, invasive species, dune management and procedures, lake shore management and procedures, cost-share and project financial assistance, etc.

All forestland assessments are completely confidential and free.

Qualified Forest Program (QFP) land tax incentive - 16 mil tax deduction on forestland.

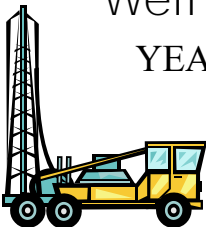

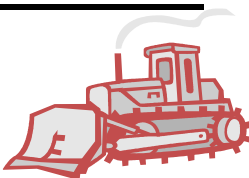

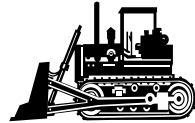
